Arrival by plane


The airport in Zurich is the largest in Switzerland. From there you can reach St.Gallen in about an hour by train or car.

Traffic and infrastructure

The road network in Switzerland is well developed. Via the A1 motorway you can drive directly to the kybunpark stadium (exit St.Gallen-Winkeln). A limited number of chargeable parking spaces are available. The motorways are subject to tolls. You can buy a motorway charge sticker (vignette) for CHF 40 at customs or in petrol station shops. It is valid for one year. The maximum speed on the motorway is 120 km/h.

Public transport

Switzerland has a well-developed rail and bus network. The smaller towns and villages are also served by bus lines. From St.Gallen main station you can reach the football stadium within 15 minutes by bus using the line 151 or 158. Depending on the occasion, an extra bus will be provided. Its location is signposted at St.Gallen main station. The stadium can also easily be reached by train. Get off the train at St.Gallen-Winkeln station. After a short walk you will reach the stadium.



Entry travel documents

Find out in good time in your home country which identity documents are required for Switzerland. In the event of a police check, you will have to be in a position to identify yourself at any time.

Alcohol consumption in road traffic

In Switzerland, vehicle drivers are fined for a blood alcohol concentration of 0.50% or more or a breath alcohol concentration of 0.25 mg/l or more. A complete ban on driving under the influence of alcohol applies to professional drivers.

Narcotics

Violations of the Narcotics Act are punished by a fine and/or a custodial sentence (imprisonment), depending on the quantity and type of narcotics. Spirits, alcopops and distilled water may only be consumed from the age of

Pyrotechnics

Carrying along and lighting fireworks of any kind is strictly forbidden at sports events and will be punished systematically.

Masking

Wearing masks is prohibited in the city of St.Gallen.

Medical care


Medical care is guaranteed. The European Health Insurance Card must be presented for medical and hospital treatment.

Stadium and surroundings

The kybunpark football stadium, which opened in 2008, has a maximum capacity of 19,568 seats and standing places. It is used to host FC St.Gallen 1879 championship matches and international football matches (17,317 seats). The different sectors and the respective accesses are shown in the following diagram.

Means of payment

Inside and around the stadium there are various food stands. You can pay your consumption with CHF and Euro (rather weak exchange rate). Credit cards are not accepted everywhere. Inside the stadium, payment is only possible with the stadium ticket, which can be obtained without a deposit at specially marked points. The card can optionally be loaded with CHF/Euro. From the middle of the second half of the match until about 30 minutes after the end of the match, the stadium ticket can be returned at one of the ticket offices and any remaining amounts can be paid out. Payment will be made in CHF only.


